





These regulations include Lake Camelot Round Table Association must approve applications for rental property, which means all paperwork for rental be submitted before renters move in-date. Members whom rent their homes must sign a rental notification for rental property with the Association and pay a fee in addition to the Association dues. The fee is the sum of the current years dues. Current rentals will have 12 month grace period with current leases/tenants. New leases/ tenants property owners must comply with the current regulations.

# **INFRASTRUCTURE/LONG RANGE PLANNING COMMITTEE (ILRPC**

Minutes – Infrastructure/Long-Range Planning Committee (ILRPC) Tuesday, February 7, 2017

Call to Order - The meeting was called to order at 5:00 PM. Committee members in attendance were Jim Sinclair, Kevin Arduini, Roger Markle, and Don Keith. Committee member absent -Suzanne Wheeler and Jeff Lox.

Report on the January 2017 RTA Meetings – Jim presented a pool complex needs matrix to the Board and requested that it be added to the Pages & Links section of the Camelot RTA website. The Board approved this request.

General Discussion – The March meeting has been moved up to Tuesday, March 7<sup>th</sup> at 5 PM at the club house.

Swimming Pool Complex –We continued our discussions about the 2017 items planned to be done include 1) replacing the two small pool gates; 2) replace the pump room door; and 3) replacing half of the pool filters. Projects that need additional research and we hope to get done include 1) pool deck concrete leveling/replacement (Jeff will have estimates for this work by the March meeting); 2) Roger will look into ideas to repair lifeguard chairs (Suzanne had determined that the cost to purchase was too expensive); 3) Don will contact Reno Systems directly to see if they can provide us a knowledgeable contact to help us assess both the liner and pump room pit; 4) Kevin will contact personnel at Hollis Grade School that has an indoor pool about the same age as ours for possible additional pool experts.

The matrix is on the Camelot Roundtable Association website's Pages and Links page. We encourage members to refer to this for monthly updates.

We welcome members to attend the monthly meetings to gain knowledge and volunteer their expertise to help us analyze the entire complex.

**Committee Projects** – No Project Request Forms were presented by the community this month.

Other possible item for 2017 consideration – Parking lots, tennis courts surface, club house deck sealing, digital signage at entrances.

## LAND & LAKES COMMITTEE

Minutes – Land & Lakes Committee Minutes Wednesday, February 1, 2017

Call to Order: Meeting was called to order at 6:30. In attendance were Glenda Carlson, Collin Cochrin, Glen DeLorme, and Deb McBeath. Also absent were Committee members John Hecker, Steve Harenberg, and Robert Wilder.

Recognized Visitors: Jill Bleichner, Dave Sule, and J B Burdette

Questions or comments from the January 18, 2017 Board Meeting: Glenda reported on the lowering of Lake Lancelot. The lake was lowered approximately 12-18 inches, but due to rains it has raised again. Lowering is still in progress. The annual dam inspection was performed during the first week of December. The inspector from Farnsworth Group was extremely pleased with the repairs that have been made since the last inspection, and has no further recommendations at this time. A copy is available at the Camelot RTA office and a copy is posted on Camelotrta.org.

#### Old Business:

- Ravine #1 (Harkers Corner Rd) Work to begin again in the Spring.
- Ravine #5 (Between Diamond Point & Sir Lionel Ct.) Work continues.
- Shoreline Stabilization Guidelines. Approved by the Board.

Continuing 2017 Review of Sediment Reduction Study. Discussed the repairs for ravine #28. The Committee agreed it makes sense to take advantage of the lot owner's offer to allow access to this ravine prior to his home being built.

The Board has also given the General Manager the task of obtaining quotes for the repair of each ravine.

Continuing New Member Recruitment

New Business:

- Emergency Action Plan-Bruce Whelchel is working with the State Dam Safety Engineer on our plan.
- The Committee is still looking to recruit a Committee Chairman.
- Need to pursue culvert repairs/replacements with the Townships.
- Committee needs to come up with ideas for identifying lot numbers from the shoreline. Utilizing the boy scouts was one suggestion. Reenacting car/trailer stickers for members was mentioned again.

Infrastructure/Long Range Planning – Committee Chairperson Jim Sinclair presented the report. See Infrastructure/Long Range Planning Minutes in the March newsletter.

Mr. Sinclair discussed pool repairs for 2017. He thanked the Board for putting Infrastructure Committee assessments and plans on the Camelotrta.org web page. Monthly updates to the pool matrix may be viewed online.

**Fundraising Committee** – Beth Emhoff reported the committee has plans for two Paint and Wine Nights the first is Saturday, February 18, 2017 and the second on Friday, March 24, 2017. Mrs. Emhoff presented new ideas to put a can recycling bin on RTA property and a Prep/Freeze Fundraiser on April 6 th. Next meeting March 2nd. Land and Lakes – Committee report was given by Glenda Carlson in absence of Deb McBeath. Glenda stated that Mrs. McBeath would be willing to accept the nomination for Chairperson to be appointed by the Board. John Hecker motioned to nominate Deb as Chairperson of the Land and Lakes Committee, Leah Allison seconded. Motion carried. Glenda reported that work is scheduled to begin on Ravine #1 in the spring & continued work on Ravine #5. **Dredging Committee** – Bill Krokos reported a review regarding the necessity to test the lakes for blue algae blooms. He stated that he spoke to an expert who does recommend testing. The expert is sending information. Bill also stated that the purpose of the Dredging Committee has been completed and the Committee would be joining with the Land and Lakes Committee to move forward with erosion control.

<u>Security Report –</u> Kris Jouchim was absent – No Report.

Bill Krokos was nominated and was chosen to receive the **Frank Loftus' Award.** This is an award recognized throughout the State of Illinois given to a *tireless volunteer for their stewardship efforts providing local lake communities and their lake users with information and ways of maintaining and caring for the lakes and/or ponds near them to maintain a better quality of water. The Board congratulates Bill for all his hard work. <u>Executive Session – Cathy Doss made a motion to go into Executive Session at 8:45 pm, seconded by Leah Allison. Motion carried.</u> Vickie Mulligan made a motion to come out of Executive Session at 9:15 p.m., seconded by Leah Allison. Motion carried.

Actions Resulting After Executive Session Board unanimously agreed to combine the position of swim team coordinator and head coach this upcoming 2017 swim season. They would like to thank Ryan and Leslie Murphy for all their volunteer services. Head Coach Quincy Merritt will assume some of the coordinators responsibilities. The remainder will be handled through the Board and the Lake Camelot Office. Board recognizes the hiring of Holli Green as the 2017 new Swim Lesson Coordinator.

Adjournment- Leah Allison made a motion to adjourn at 9:18 p.m., seconded by Bill Krokos. Motion carried, all in favor.






