

Minutes - Land & Lakes Committee

Wednesday, April 2, 2014

Call to Order: The meeting was called to order at 6:30. Committee members in attendance were Glenda Carlson, Collin Cochran, Glen Delorme, Lynn Gosnell, Keith Johnson, Deb Metroff, Richard Novitsky, Bernie Sieks and Bruce Whelchel.

Report on the March 19th Board Meeting: Collin gave a brief report of the meeting. Collin thanked all the committee members that were able to attend the meeting.

Plans for Completing Erosion Control Project Number 1 (from 2013):

There has been no progress on this project due to weather conditions. The contractor plans to complete the project in the next couple of weeks, depending on work site conditions and weather. Collin will check with the Sportsman Club to see if anyone would volunteer to help with the burning of the wood piles. Discussed the possibility of the fire department burning the piles for practice. The committee discussed final grading and seeding and agreed that we should hire the contractor that will be finishing the erosion control work (redirecting the water flow). It was reported that he can final grade, seed, and straw the area for \$700-\$1000. Weather permitting, the project should be completed by May.

Completing Work on the Lower Lake Boat Ramp: Project is complete and the committee agrees that the contractor did a good job and our maintenance staff did a nice job with the finishing work.

Dam & Bridge Inspection Reports:

- 1. Dam Inspection Report: The committee agreed that the report refers to several items that our maintenance staff takes care of on a regular basis. The report identifies the lower lake spillway as a problem area that the committee needs to research further before developing a plan. Bruce volunteered to make contact with someone that might be able to help us.
- 2. Bridge Inspection Report: The committee agreed that we should obtain additional professional opinion before developing a plan. Bruce will make contacts before the committee proceeds with any plans.

Lake Treatment: Tabled until next meeting. Hopefully, Greg and/or Dennis will be able to attend our next committee meeting to discuss what their goals and plans are for treating the lakes. Glenda will coordinate.

Erosion Control and Siltation Projects Number 1 & 2 for 2014 (The siltation ponds at the North end of Lake Camelot and the West end of Lake Lancelot):

The Board accepted our recommendation and approved the projects. Steve, Glenda, and Bruce met with the contractor to go over the details of the projects. They also walked the project areas and discussed construction details. Steve will take the lead managing the project, Bruce and Collin will assist. The project is on hold right now due to the weight restrictions on the roads (possibly until mid May, or later). Bruce will stay in contact with the Township Road Commissioner to see if we can begin earlier. There is a concern with a buried phone cable that runs through the woods and under the lake in the project area near the West end of Lake Lancelot. Bruce talked to engineers from AT&T and they will meet with him and Glenda on Friday, April 4th to determine if the cable can be relocated. Kevin Sipp notified Bruce that he will have a mix of scrap dirt and rock that he is willing to provide for our projects. If the dirt and rock is available, Bruce will coordinate with the contractor to determine the best location to store the material, until needed.

Erosion Control and Siltation for 2014:

- 1. **Removing Lake Siltation**: Bernie and Richard gave an update on the development of a plan for removing silt from our lakes. The discussion focused on identifying problem areas and the depth of siltation in the areas identified. It was brought up that a few years ago the Herman Brothers prepared a report that included some work on determining siltation depths. Members that were on the committee would look for the report. The committee agreed that once we determine the magnitude of the siltation and methods for controlling erosion into the lakes; we can begin to develop the best alternatives for controlling and removing the siltation.
- 2. Strategy for working with neighboring land owners (with the help of Scott Wallace and Gary Gorden from the USDA-NRCS) to control erosion into our lakes: Deb and Glenda, Deb, Steve S., with get together on this project.
- 3. The park access area that runs between Tewksbury and Canterbury: Bernie is still working on the area as weather allows. Will need to determine if we are able to get equipment into this area.

New Business:

- 1. **Additional Rip Rap**: Collin pointed out that there needs to be additional rock placed at one of the previous projects at the lower dam. Glenda and Bruce will check into purchasing rock..
- 2. Winter Fish Kill: Glen passed around pictures of fish kill on our lakes. According to Rob Hilsabeck fish kill happened all over central Illinois. He stated that the thick ice and snow attributes to oxygen deprivation and kills the fish. Rob also stated that the kill in our lakes was probably less severe than other lakes in the area. Shallow lakes like Eureka Lake had a very severe fish kill.

Next committee meeting - May 7th

Adjournment: Meeting adjourned at 8:30 p.m.

<u>Call to Order</u> – Vice President Brian Woertz called the meeting to order at 6:30 pm. Board Members in attendance were Steve Schmidt, Matt Buczynski, Leah Allison, Steve Harenberg, Gary Smith, William Whitehurst and Cathy Doss; board member Lynn Johnston was absent. Also in attendance was Glenda Carlson, General Manager.

<u>Approval of Minutes</u> – Steve Schmidt made the motion to approve the March 19th, 2014 meeting minutes. Motion seconded by Leah Allison. All in favor-Motion carried.

Finance Report - Leah Allison presented the Finance Report. Monthly Income and Expense statement was reviewed for March 2014.

Recognition of Members and Guests – In attendance were Collin Cochran, Jim Sinclair, Brian Emhoff, Don Thompson, Beth Dains and Leslie Murphy. Beth Dains introduced Leslie Murphy as the new swim team coordinator announcing that a coach has been hired and registrations set in the clubhouse for April 28th. Meets have been set up with a new one being in Havana. Excited to be having a meet with a team comparable in size. The General Manager announced the meets, if the board approves the calendar, would be posted on the boards at the pool house, on the FB page and on the new Lake Camelot home page. Bill Whitehurst made a motion, Gary Smith seconded to approve the calendar as submitted, motion carried. The board welcomed Leslie for taking over the new responsibilities and Beth for her many years of service. She is continuing to help with the transition as Leslie takes over and the Board would like to again thank Beth for continuing to show her support to the Lake Camelot Community!!

Committee Reports

Infrastructure – Jim Sinclair reported on his findings with regards to the clubhouse restrooms; the requirements for remodeling/replacement for private vs. non-private clubs and other inquiries they had been looking into. After much discussion, it was the direction of the board for this committee to obtain three costs estimates, one way being to obtain costs to bring the two restrooms upstairs in the clubhouse to code making them handicap accessible and the other to provide costs for those currently in need of repair or replacement (same as) while upgrading the look of the restrooms. Thus, providing the board with cost ranges and future budgeting opportunities.

Land and Lakes – Steve Harenberg and Collin Cochran reported on plans to complete the erosion control project from 2013. Weather permitting it should be done in May. The committee will continue to work on projects for erosion control and siltation removal for 2014. Further, the committee did request the board approve the change for the bass size slot limits from 12" to 18" to 14" to 18" inches as recommended by Rob Hilsabeck in his most recent report. Gary Smith made a motion and seconded by Steve Harenberg. Motion Carried. (Minutes from Meeting-Pg 7)

Covenant Review - NO REPORT

Security Report – Brian Emhoff reported no security issues at the clubhouse complex or RTA property over the last thirty days. He further requested information with regards to the start date of the Peoria County officer whom assisted in the patrol of the grounds at the clubhouse last season. The General Manager stated funds had been set aside in the budget for him to begin after the last week of May when school has been dismissed and is to run through August 2014.

2014 Violations/Tree Removals— Report Update-Letters mailed with regards to additional removal of trees needed now that lakes are no longer frozen **Oak Table/Replacement** - Tables have been received and set up in the Clubhouse. A big thanks to the Activities Club for this contribution!

Aquatic Weed Control - Maintenance has begun purchasing the spray equipment and costing the chemicals for in-house weed control. **July 5th Fireworks Celebration-** The General Manager reported planning continues on schedule.

2013 Annual Review & Tax Return - Not yet received from Rotherham & Co. The General Manager informed the Board the Mr. Rotherham's office indicates we should be receiving it no later than Wednesday, April 23rd.

Dam Inspection/Foth 2013/2014- Further review needed by Board for discussion

Pool Chemical Bids - The General Manager presented information regarding four bids solicited for chemical maintenance purchase for the 2014 swimming season. Leah Allison made a motion and Steve Harenberg seconded to accept the bid from Convenient Pool Supply. Motion carried.

2014 Lake Management Conference- General Manager reported both she and Greg Dennis attended the conference in Sandwich, Illinois with good and new information being received on a variety of lake topics which will be put together and shared with both the land and lakes committee and the board prior to the next meeting.

Lot 706- The Board revisited the review by our attorney's office with regards to ownership of said lot and instructed the General Manager to proceed with recommendation to try to secure payment of back dues owed.

New Business

Community Clean up-Day - The General Manager requested a day for community clean-up. A review of the month of May concluded the weekends during that month were booked through the end. First thing, we would like to thank the Lake Camelot community for their continued support and making and Annual Spaghetti Dinner a success. I would also like to congratulate and thank Mr. Bob Janssen, who was the winner of our 50/50 drawing and was so gracious as to donate his winnings back to the Fireman's Corporation. The proceeds raised go toward the purchase of extra equipment and education that the fire department does not cover or does not initially cover such as; personal flashlights, helmet lights, tools, and EMT Basic classes.

In the next few months Peoria County Police and Fire Districts will be switching to a new trunked radio system. This system will allow us to talk on our own channels for more clear communication, eliminating "dead spots", and communication clashes with other entities talking on the same channel. Many of you that have scanners in your homes will notice this change as you may hear the initial call or "tone out" then nothing else as the new system will not be picked up by the scanners. Some internet sites may pick up the trunked transmissions on about a 5-6 second delay.

During our EMS calls many will notice that we are very "tight lipped" when it comes to discussing or divulging information on or off scenes as to why we are there or the condition of the people at the residence or scene. Much like the hospitals we are bound by HIPPA (Health information Protection Act) and part of our duty is to protect the information of our patients. This can be difficult for those that watch over and protect the neighbors around them as we cannot tell them what has happened or the condition of the person unless the patient has requested. This is something that tends to be asked at many of our calls or afterward and we have to politely refuse to answer the questions. Many will claim "Freedom of Information Act" to obtain the person's condition or information on the incident. To go this route, you must fill out the proper paper work according to the guidelines of the facility the patient has been transported to and approval by the family.
